As a member of <u>CAE</u> Network, on March 21st and 22nd CUMEDIAE took part in the <u>Members Forum 2019</u>.

The forum was an opportunity to make considerations about how the Network will **develop and maximise its impact** on advocacy in the cultural and creative sector in the future.

On Day 1 the discussion concerned the potential **strategy for the next three years**, as well as the possibility of organising regional hubs and thematic working groups. On Day 2, there was analysis and strategic discussions concerning political developments at both European and international level, that impacted the CCIs. Beyond this members discussed CAE's role and activities within the framework of community development and creation of key collaborations, including within the context of the European Parliamentary Elections 2019. Members took part in policy dialogue with EACEA representatives on the future and expectations regarding the next Creative

SouthMed Wia organized two <u>meetings</u> to advocate for more **gender equality** in the audio-visual sector in the Southern Mediterranean countries.

The first meeting was hosted by the **Higher School of Audiovisual and Cinema (ESAC)** and held on 25 February 2019 in Tunis. The <u>second</u> <u>one</u>, organised by the **Screen Institute Beirut (SIB)**, was hosted by the **Royal Film Commission** and held on 28 March 2019 in Amman, Jordan.

During the events, the beneficiaries of the sub-granted projects gave an overview of their actions and shared experiences, achievements and challenges encountered during the projects' implementation.

These events aimed to bring together different key stakeholders, authorities and professionals from the targeted region in order to create a space for dialogue and propose possible strategies, actions and measures on how to improve **the participation of women in the audio-visual sector** and the use of their image in the local audio-visual products.

The first, on February 28th, as part of the 1st International Conference and the 2nd, on March 28th, as an expert in an international round table discussion on "How to create the ideal conditions for supporting CCIs growth".

The <u>Interreg Traces</u> project is financed under <u>Interreg V-A Greece-Italy</u> <u>Programme</u>, focuses on cultural and creative micro and small and medium enterprises in Apulia and Western Greece regions and addresses the common challenge to promote creative entrepreneurship as a key contributor to competitiveness across all economic and social sectors. Traces will develop a creative service exchange ICT platform, where creatives can share services between Greece and Italy.
